The board of directors recently decided to further reduce dividend rates on money market accounts effect October 1. Current money market dividend rates are .15% for \$1,000—\$9,999, .20% \$10,000—\$99,999 and .25% over \$100,000.

Everyone loves a good scare on Halloween, but not when it comes to child safety. There are several easy and effective behaviors that parents can share with kids to help reduce their risk of injury.

A hard fact to face is that on average, children are more than twice as likely to be hit by a car and killed on Holloween than any other day of the year.

Here are some tips to keep in mind to help protect your child and the children around you:

1. When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

2. Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors. Since masks can sometimes obstruct a child's vision, try non-toxic face paint and makeup whenever possible.

3. Have kids use glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.

4. Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, they should stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.


5. Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible.

6. Popular trick-or-treating hours are 5:30 pm to 9:30 pm, so be especially alert for kids during those hours.

7. Slow down and be especially alert when driving in residential neighborhoods, because children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.

8. Remind children to eat only treats in their original unopened wrappers.
