Financial Self Defense: Identity Theft and Technology - Smartphones

A recent study by The Javelin Group found the incidence of identity theft was up 13%, compared to the previous year. The total amount stolen was about the same, but the thieves successfully scammed more people. The study found that smartphone users were a third more likely to be victims of identity theft than non-smartphone users. What can you do to avoid being a victim?

*Password protect your phone.

*Don't use credit cards for Internet transactions over public networks. Thieves have "sniffers" that can extract that data.

*Don't store credit card numbers or bank account information on your laptop.

*Use different passwords for mobile banking apps on your phone than passwords you do for your phone and email.

*Promptly report any suspicion that your sensitive personal information has been compromised.

*Keep documents that list Social Security numbers off of your laptop, or encrypt that data if you do store there.

*Keep private information private. If any company uses specific information about you to verify your identity—your mother's maiden name, pet names, birthdays, etc., keep it off Facebook and any other social media site.

Arranging the Mandatory Electronic Payment of Your Federal Benefits

Direct Deposit and Your Credit Union

Americans who enroll for federal government benefit payments — including Social Security, Supplemental Security Income, Veterans Affairs, Office of Personnel Management and Railroad Retirement Board — on or after May 1, 2011, will receive them **only by direct deposit** (or the government's Direct Express Debit MasterCard program).

Any person that now receives paper checks for government benefit payments will be switched to direct deposit or the government debit card by March 1, 2013.

If you as a beneficiary do not specify direct deposit into your credit union, you will automatically be enrolled in the government debit card program.

There are many good reasons for you to use direct deposit services. Here are just three:

SAFE: It lessens your chances of becoming a fraud victim.

EASY: You don't have to take any action — on the scheduled day the payment is sent electronically to your account.

FAST: Your money is in the credit union and immediately available to you.

You will need three pieces of information to arrange direct deposit: your **credit union's routing number**, (Mid-Kansas Credit Union's routing number is 301179216) and your **account number** (Your nine digit account number — 006677801 in savings and in checking 006677810) (example only) and **account type** (checking or savings — in your savings account the last two digits are 01 and in checking the last two digits are 10).

Switching from checks to direct deposit is fast, easy and free at www.GoDirect.org, by calling the U.S. Treasury Processing Center's toll-free helpline at 2 (800) 333-1795, or by calling your credit union.



For the past 27 years, you have allowed me to assist you, the members of Mid-Kansas Credit Union. I have enjoyed editing the newsletter as well.
